The college reflects the ethos of Sri Mannathu Padmanabhan, one of the greatest social reformers of Kerala, and the founder of Nair Service Society. The college is sincerely engaged in providing free and fair education to all without any discrimination of class, creed and community; rather due consideration is given to the economically backward sections of the society.

The foundation stone of Sree Vidyadhi Raja NSS College was laid on 27th April, 1965 and it started functioning as a Junior College. In 1977, the College was upgraded to an Arts and Science College that offers Under Graduate courses.

The College is recognized under Section 2(f) and Section 12(B) of the UGC Act, 1956 and is affiliated to Mahatma Gandhi University, Kottayam. In the NAAC accreditation, second cycle undergone in 2016, the college has been accredited with B grade (CGPA=2.68).
